Their vision is a province where people with FASD and women who have used alcohol during pregnancy are fully accepted and their dignity is promoted. One way they are promoting dignity is the development of a series of documentaries.

The newest documentary called *Learning the Dance: Community Making a Difference*, shares the story of how two schools have focused on relationships, built upon strengths, and reframed behaviours in order to support two students with FASD to find success and a sense of belonging within the school community.
