

A few weeks ago, the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences announced that they were undertaking an assessment on FASD. This work is funded by the Public Health Agency of Canada.

The Chair of the Assessment Panel on Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder has been appointed: <u>Jennifer Chandler</u>. Ms. Chandler is a Professor of Law at the Centre for Health Law, Policy and Ethics and Vice Dean (Research) at the University of Ottawa also cross-appointed to the Faculty of Medicine. She holds the Bertram Loeb Research Chair.
