BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT

Looking After Each Other: A Dignity Promoting Project

LAEO Background: Many efforts to prevent Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) have perpetuated stigma, discrimination, and misunderstandings about FASD, having negative impacts on individuals and the communities.

Purpose: To identify and remove stigma and discrimination and explore approaches that promote dignity of children, adults, families, and communities impacted by FASD.



What is PhotoVoice?

Photovoice is an activity that uses photos and voice to tell a story about an issue, concern, or need.

Participants will be asked to photograph things in the community to illustrate their response to set of questions on FASD and dignity, stigma, discrimination, barriers to services, and solutions to promote dignity in FASD. These questions will help guide participants in choosing scenes or objects to photograph.

PhotoVoice can be done by anyone regardless of artistic skills. Each photo contains a story with meaning and showcases people's diverse perspectives and lived experiences.

What has been done

We have worked together with multiple people with lived experiences. Photos used in this infographic were taken by our participants.
